The Archaeological Museum of Barro (MAB) preserves and exhibits over 400 original finds, found during the archaeological excavations carried out at Piani di Barra (V e VI sec. d.c.) and Monte Castelletto (XIII sec. d.c.).

In the rooms of the museum you can travel back in time discovering the everyday objects of the ancient inhabitants who, in the period of the settlement of the Goths on this territory, lived in a fortified village on the slopes of the mountain.

The showcases display jewelry, coins, clothing accessories, pottery, glass, furniture elements, lamps and much more. One of the most valuable finds is the hanging crown, found during the excavations of the Great Building, constitutes one of the few specimens in the world.

The materials coming from the fortified site of Monte Castelletto document a historical moment in which the first firearms, that began to spread in Europe during the fourteenth century, were flanked by the white weapons of ancient tradition.

The archaeological route is completed with a visit to the archaeological area of Piani di Barra and to the site of Monte Castelletto, where the remains of the settlements can be visited, and with the excursion along the "Sentiero delle torri" (path of the towers).
